BIS announces the Enterprise Champions Programme

The Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS) announced in March that it will support every school to develop and run its own business through the Enterprise Champions Programme.

This is part of a package of four new announcements to help inspire, support and grow new businesses in the UK. These announcements come alongside the launch of Start-Up Britain, the response from the private sector to the Government's call for an 'enterprise-led' recovery.

The Enterprise Champions Programme will enable schools to set up and manage a business. Schools will be given access to online resource materials and tools which will give practical advice for teachers. The Government will help schools engage local enterprise champions to support school businesses and extend learning into the commercial environment. The Department for Business, Innovation and Skills (BIS) will be working with the Education and Employers Taskforce to have all elements of the programme up and running by the end this year.

Growing Ambitions will become part of the Taskforce's Inspiring the Future employee volunteering in education network which is launching in autumn 2011. In the meantime, we will be getting in touch with all the people who signed up as speakers and volunteers in schools to explain the next steps.

The Taskforce's employee volunteering network will mobilise 100,000s of volunteers into the education sectors as everything from reading buddies to school governors. Sally Davies, the founder of Growing Ambitions, created it as a result of getting poor quality careers advice for her teenage son. Sally recognised that nearly everyone uses the internet, so it role as a matchmaker between young people, employers and people doing the jobs they aspire to is obvious. Over the next two years she approached businesses around England to sign up to talk to young people about the jobs they do, and what qualifications and experience they needed to get there. Much of her network of 1000s of volunteers came from word of mouth.



Thank you to everyone who submitted evidence to the DfE funding review in January and February. There was an excellent response to the call for evidence. The Department for Education asked the Taskforce to manage and coordinate a high-level review estimating the returns on investment for different kinds of employer engagement in education and an assessment of the costs and benefits of different delivery options, in order to inform government policy from April 2012 onwards.

The decision on EBPO funding

The Schools Minister Nick Gibb has outlined his position on work experience and Education Business Partnership Organisations. The government are prioritising spending on front line services in schools.

It will be for schools to decide whether or not to buy in services from education business partnership organisations (EBPOs). Therefore EBPOs will need to ensure they are offering a high quality service and having the Award for Education Business Excellence will help signify that. In a letter Nick Gibb said: "The involvement of employers in education benefits young people, schools and businesses and, in my view, there are excellent opportunities for employers to help us to deliver our reforms."
